BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of Cliffside Park wish to enter into a Bergen County Trust Fund Project Contract ("Contract") with the County of Bergen for the purpose of using a \$75,000.00 matching grant award from the 2017 Funding Round of the Bergen County Open Space, Recreation, Floodplain Protection, Farmland & Historic Preservation Trust Fund ("Trust Fund") for the municipal park project entitled "Improvements to Columbus Park" located in Columbus Park located on Block(s) 3304, Lot(s) 10 on the tax maps of the Borough of Cliffside Park; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council hereby authorize the Mayor Thomas Calabrese and/or Administrator Joseph Rutch to be a signatory to the aforesaid Contract; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council hereby acknowledge that, in general, the use of this Trust Fund grant towards this approved park project must be completed by or about August 1, 2020; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council acknowledge that the grant will be disbursed to the municipality as a reimbursement upon submittal of certified Trust Fund payment and project completion documents and municipal vouchers, invoices, proofs of payment, and other such documents as may be required by the County in accordance with the Trust Fund's requirements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council acknowledge that the grant disbursement to the municipality will be equivalent to fifty (50) percent of the eligible costs incurred (not to exceed total grant award) applied towards only the approved park improvements identified in the aforesaid Contract in accordance with the Trust Fund's requirements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that should there be an unexpended balance at the completion of the project, Professional Services Costs will be reimbursed from grant award's unexpended balance in accordance with the Municipal Park Improvement Program Rules and Procedures Manual.

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basements. It has been more since the Middle School was expanded. The residents were advised that DPW will look into the situation with our borough engineer.

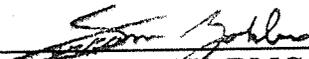
On a motion by Councilman Bongard, seconded by Councilwoman Martinotti, the meeting was closed to the public.
